Learning Cycles (LCs) are a tool for teachers to examine written curriculum and give deep feedback to each other in aligned ways.


In LCs small teams of teachers work together to share curriculum and give it feedback after seeing their colleagues in action.

Learning Cycles are *"for teachers, by teachers"* with the support of the district and school administrators. They are not related to the evaluation process.

Round 4 Celebrate the year's Learning Cycles work.

Revise, Try out,

Consult. Refine

Revise, Try out, Consult, Refine, Publish (V3)

Round 3

Conduct peer observations in order to see curriculum in action & give each other feedback towards Standards-based Alignment & powerful learning.

Revise, Try out, Consult, Refine, Publish (V2)

Begin: Decide on the year's Learning Cycles focus/options & build vertical teacher teams. Use district Successful Habits of Mind & Understanding by Design curriculum writing template throughout cycle.

Revise, Try out, Consult, Refine

Round 1 Choose from variety of protocol options, with an eye to standards-based alignment, Successful Habits of Mind and powerful learning.

Revise, Try out, Consull, Refine, Pubish (VI)

Round 2 Continue to share curriculum, using protocols & with an eye to building towards looking at data (including from peer observations) together.
